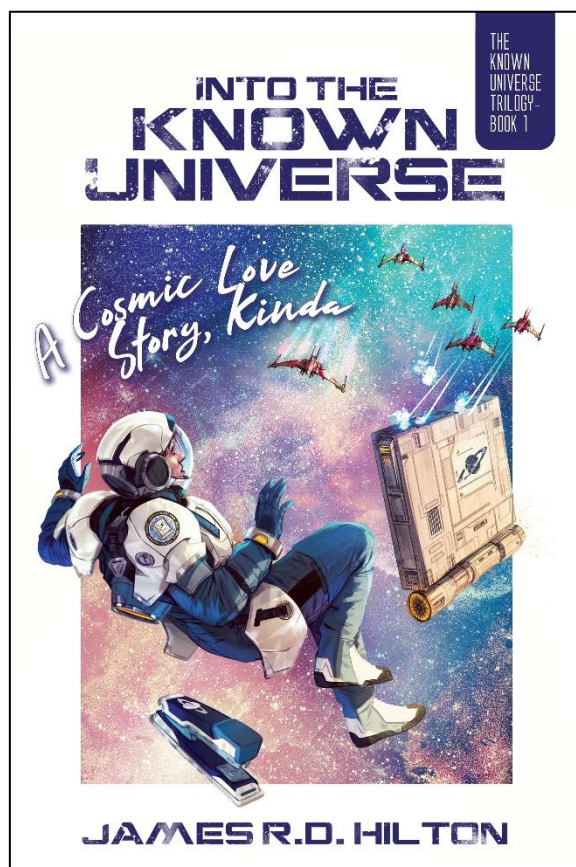
Though their journey into the known universe is just beginning, it's shaping up to be one hell of a ride.

SAMPLE INTERVIEW QUESTIONS:

- **How long have you been writing?**
 - *Ten years exactly! I started writing creatively at the suggestion of a mentor when I was attending Humber College, where I was pursuing writing for television (my lost dream).*
- **What was your first publishing success?**
 - *In 2018 I sold my first short story, "Space Toast," to Pulp Kings for \$300, which I immediately spent on having my first rejection letter for the same story framed. It hangs above my desk to this day.*
- **What inspired you to write *Into the Known Universe*?**
 - *This book started as a four-part serial for Pulp Kings and gradually grew into a novel.*
- **Are all your stories in the same universe?**
 - *Yes! Since 2018, all my stories (so far) are set in the Known Universe. The crossover potential is limitless!*
- **What made you want to self-publish?**
 - *A mountain of rejection letters from literary agents! After four years, the writing was on the wall.*
- **What does your writing process look like?**
 - *First comes extensive outlining, then character profiles, followed finally by actual writing. A wise man once said, 80% of writing happens before you've written a word.*
- **What's your advice to new authors?**
 - *Don't write a book! Start with an easier, more manageable goal, like scaling Kilimanjaro. Or maybe try writing a short story first and see how you do.*
- **Who are your creative inspirations?**
 - *Gene Roddenberry, George Lucas, Steven Spielberg, Arthur C. Clarke, Terry Pratchett, and, of course, the late great Douglas Adams.*
- **Is there a sequel in the works?**
 - *Two sequels! This is the first in a trilogy. Beyond that, well . . . it's a big universe.*
